Students worked in teams to assemble working models of traffic lights and even simulated traffic flow. It was a fun and illuminating way (literally!) to understand science and safety.



Elephants are more than just majestic animals- they are guardians of the earth, spreading seeds, creating waterholes, and shaping habitats for countless species.





The programme concluded with the Vote of Thanks by APAI, followed by Vaazhthu and the National Anthem at 12:40 p.m.

Literacy Day Teacher


GBPS staff observed Literacy Day by taking a pledge to uphold the value of education and work towards spreading knowledge and awareness among students and society, promote the importance of education for all.

Yoga Champion


